ALL YACHTS – ANY FLAG	COMMERCIAL OR PLEASURE REGISTRY	WITH PERMANENT PROFESSIONAL CREW	
	TRANSIT	Passing through French waters without dropping anchor nor going into port : No need for any declaration or approval	
	ARRIVAL	Without prior approval but must show health declaration prior entry in French waters. Going to port, most will also need to show SSEC	
	DEPARTURE	Subject to health declaration prior departure	
USE OF BOATS	NAVIGATION	Navigation is back to normal rules, no Covid restrictions apply to yachts.	
	PASSENGERS	Allowed to embark if they can arrive to the boat as per travel restrictions between countries. No entry into France with passenger allowed currently except from Monaco.	
	PORTS	Ports are open – some may require up to 48h notice so do not hesitate to ask your local AGENTS office	
	ANCHORAGE /DP BEACHES & TOYS	Allowed subject to lighthouse approval for yachts +45m LOA / +300GT as per general navigation rules in France From June 2 nd the rule in France (related to Covid19) is generally ‘no rules’ the restrictions are set only locally and not nationally Only the social distance in public places including beaches and restaurants are maintained and only the greater Paris area is still under higher surveillance. Swimming, jet ski, toys all allowed as per normal rules. Some towns may still have restricted access to some parts of beaches so do not hesitate to ask your local AGENTS office Group events on the water is still not allowed (fairs, races, etc)	
GUESTS ASHORE	ROAD / TRANSPORT	Free circulation in continental France – no declarations needed Driving into France crossing the border still requires a valid reason and a declaration (e.g. crew change, residence, urgent family matters) Public transport in greater Paris subject to employers declaration during rush hours. Taxi/limo services may require guests to use face masks and have limited seating.	
	SHOPS	Shops are open with limitation on numbers of persons at same time, use of face masks, social distancing.	
	RESTAURANTS	Restaurants are allowed to open with social distancing of min 1m between tables. Some only allow guests with prior booking Tables of max 10 persons in a group allowed	
	HOTELS	Allowed to open from June 2 nd with social distancing rules.	
	COVID PROTECTION	Some towns have compulsory use of face masks in public space but in general on voluntary basis.	
	CREW CHANGE	Schengen/UK	Holding a seaman book and ‘EU attestation’ for travelling to/from the boat is required crossing borders at least till Schengen borders will open.
		Non Schengen	Schengen borders announced to be open from possibly June 15 th . If already inside Schengen, we can still get passport stamped ‘in’ to leave or ‘out’ if remaining on board (to avoid overstay) While Schengen borders are closed, seafarers are still allowed to travel holding seaman book and ‘EU attestation’ (required by airlines to embark)

GUEST TRAVEL	ARRIVAL IN FRANCE	For non French nationals, private aviation allows pax to arrive based on proof of income tax residence in France or holding Monegasque residence card. From June 15 th France allow Schengen/EU nationals to arrive (subject to official publication still). Schengen borders are announced to be open by June 15 th but each country can still limit access. Indications in France to limit some access till July 1 st / August 1 st – still to be confirmed.	
	DEPARTURE	Restrictions related to destination restrictions rather than French restrictions.	

MONACO

ALL BOATS	TRANSIT ARRIVAL	<p>Passing though Monegasque without dropping anchor nor going into port : No need for any declaration or approval Boats coming from a EU/Schengen country is allowed but must show health declaration prior entry in Monegasque waters if last call +48h ago Arrival in port subject to request and prior approval. Quarantine of 14 days applied for all non-EU/non-Schengen and UK crew and passengers – Quarantine is lifted with negative Covid tests results done upon arrival.</p>
	DEPARTURE	Subject to health declaration prior departure
USE OF BOATS	NAVIGATION	Back to normal as before Covid.
	PASSENGERS	As per boat restrictions
	PORTS	Ports are open
	BEACHES & TOYS	From June 2 nd Swimming, jet ski, toys all allowed as per normal rules – social distancing apply (Larvotto partially closed for works)
GUESTS ASHORE	ROAD / TRANSPORT	No restrictions to enter or leave Monaco. French controls in France prior to entering Monaco still takes place to control legal presence in France. Some taxi/limo services may require guests to use face masks
	SHOPS	Shops are open with limitation on numbers of persons at same time, use of face masks, social distancing.
	RESTAURANTS	Opening allowed with social distancing which result in prior bookings required for many restaurants
	HOTELS	Allowed to open but not all open. Opening will take place gradually between now and begin July with social distancing rules.
	CASINOS	Some open with social distancing rules.
CREW CHANGE	All nationalities	MONACO is not Schengen but apply Schengen rules with reporting to French authorities. Rules for arrival as per French rules
	Quarantine	New arriving crew from outside Schengen/EU and UK nationals subject to 14 days quarantine onboard if possible or in hotel/apartment close by. Quarantine is lifted earlier after proven negative PCR+blood tests. If tests are positive with crew onboard, the boat will be in quarantine beyond the 14 days till all crew shows negative.
GUEST TRAVEL	ARRIVAL IN MONACO	Coming from non Schengen/EU/UK : travel still restricted if not holding French income tax residence or Monegasque residence card. From June 15 th France allow Schengen/EU/UK nationals to arrive. Schengen borders are announced to be open by June 15 th but each country can still limit access Monaco is not Schengen but subject to follow French rules.
